The CA SAT Prep program is designed to help college bound students improve their scores on competitive standardized tests with particular emphasis on the SAT I and the PSAT/NMSQT. This program is open to students in Grades 10, 11, and 12. The fall session is scheduled on seven consecutive **Sundays** from August 28 to October 9. The winter session begins January 22 and ends March 4. Classes meet from **1:30 p.m. to 4:15 p.m.** at The Columbus Academy, 4300 Cherry Bottom Road in Gahanna, one mile south of the Cherry Bottom and Morse Road intersection.

Faculty: The instructors for the program are veteran members of The Academy faculty who have had numerous years experience teaching SAT and ACT preparation courses. In addition, the faculty study the SAT I, PSAT, and ACT tests on a regular basis to stay current with the test and its demands.

Class size is limited to twenty students per section. These sections will be determined by grade level and previous test experience. Actual SAT I and PSAT exams will be used to pre-test and post-test the students as well as to target areas for emphasis.

Although the SAT I and PSAT test will remain the major area of focus, increased emphasis will be placed on preparation for the ACT testing program. As the number of schools accepting the ACT increases, and with the movement towards the ACT as a substitute for other testing programs, we felt it important to increase the time spent on ACT preparation. The Critical Reading section will include reading passages with sentence completion and passage-based questions. The Writing Section involves questions on grammar, usage, and word choice as well as a short student-written essay. The Mathematics Test will cover number operations; Algebra I and II; geometry; statistics, and probability. Standard multiple choice questions comprise the majority of the test. Quantitative comparisons and student-produced responses that require the demonstration of problem-solving skills and the use of a calculator are also a significant part of the SAT I.

The cost of the program is **\$360**, which includes a text, sample tests and handouts. The fall schedule enables the student to prepare for the PSAT, to be given October 12 and 15, as well as the SAT I to be given November 5, December 3, and January 28. The winter course schedule enables students to complete the program before the SAT I to be given March 10, May 5, and June 2.
