










- College Board "Understanding your PSAT scores" (video)
- Given to grades 10 & 11 at Columbus Academy in October as practice for the SAT
- Avg. PSAT for juniors at CA (Fall '19) = 1226
- Highest Possible Selection Index score = 228
- National Merit Recognition (announced in Sept.)
 - Last year for OH, 219+ = NM Semifinalist
 - Different states have different cutoffs
- Grade 11 score can qualify a student for NM






SAT v. ACT

- Colleges will take either the SAT or ACT for admission. No preference.
- Very few colleges/universities require the writing section
 - Note: Those who currently require it have talked about dropping it
- On average, CA students take an exam 2-3 times, beginning in 11th grade
- Register on-line
 - www.collegeboard.org
 - www.actstudent.org
- College Counseling office can provide fee waivers
- Average ACT Composite at CA = 29
- Average SAT Total at CA = 1325
- Test Prep consider your options
 - BWS class at CA (see handout)
 - RevolutionPrep.com (see handout)
 - Private Tutoring (Princeton Review Premier Tutors, Kaplan, etc.)
 - FREE On-line SAT prep via Khan Academy link to student's PSAT

- SAT and ACT -- Do NOT take the writing section
 - unless applying to UC schools, and U.S. Military Academy (West Point)
- Option coming (Fall 2020) to retake ACT by sections- stay tuned as we monitor this development
- Test Optional admission gaining traction but we still recommend all CA students take ACT/SAT tests




SAT Subject Tests

- Each exam is one hour
- Student may take up to 3 on a test day
- Available in Math, Science, English, History, Languages
- Required by very few colleges
 - Declining market share
 - Less than 20% of Academy students take these
 - Check <u>www.compassprep.com/compass-guide</u>
 - Ask during campus visit or check college's website
 - However, this is a way for students to demonstrate their mastery on a national level of a subject



How many schools REQUIRE Subject Tests?





Yes, if you are confident that you can score high (at least 700+) and demonstrate your mastery.

To "superscore" SAT, simply add two highest sections
To "superscore" ACT, add four subsections (not Writing) and divide by 4



High Scores in Context

In Columbus Academy's Class of 2020, 16 students scored at 34+ on the ACT. 5 of the 16 students scored a perfect 36.



Test Optional Colleges

- Over 1000 schools do not require an SAT or ACT score from applicants
- Examples: Bowdoin, Wake Forest, Hamilton, Holy Cross, Denison, Bates, Mount Holyoke, University of Chicago
- More emphasis on academic performance




AP Exams

- Registration is now in the fall
 - allows access to online study tools such as the AP Question Bank for students/teachers
- Student may choose to self-report scores from these exams to colleges (there is a place for this on the Common Application)
- These tests are not required, but they are another way to demonstrate mastery on a national level
