Summer Reading Ideas for Students Entering the Three-Year-Old Program Authors We Love

- <u>Duck & Goose</u> by Tad Hills The first in an adorable series about two birds who are best friends despite their opposite tastes. Headed to the beach? Read <u>Duck & Goose</u> go to the beach.
- <u>Ducks away</u> by Mem Fox What is mother duck to do when a sudden wind sweeps one of her ducklings into the river? Also check out <u>But where's the green sheep?</u>
- Max and Ruby books by Rosemary Wells Enjoy the adventures of this sibling pair.
- Go sleep in your own bed! by Candace Fleming The farm animals are all mixed up
 and trying to sleep in the wrong beds. Also check out <u>Bulldozer's big day</u>.

Trucks and Things That Go

- Amazing Machines Series by Tony Mitton and Ant Parker <u>Dazzling diggers</u> and <u>Roaring rockets</u> are some of the great titles in this rhyming series.
- <u>Mighty, mighty construction site</u> by Sheri Duskey Rinker A team of trucks works together to make a big job seem small. Also read <u>Goodnight, goodnight construction</u> site.
- <u>I'm dirty</u> by Kate McMullan A hardworking backhoe loader doesn't mind getting dirty on the job. You might also try <u>I'm mighty</u>, <u>I'm smart</u>, <u>I'm fast</u>, or <u>I stink</u>.

Animal Stories

- Goodnight gorilla by Peggy Rathmann A mischievous gorilla isn't ready for bedtime yet.
- <u>Little red cat who ran away and learned his ABC's (the hard way)</u> by Patrick McDonnell In this nearly wordless book, a red cat goes on an epic adventure.
- <u>Tails</u> by Matthew Van Fleet Feel your way through an animal book of tails. This book features exciting and exotic animals. Lots to feel, pull, push, and see on each page.
- Where's Spot? by Eric Hill Join the adorable puppy Spot and his loving mother Sally on all sorts of adventures. Children will enjoy lifting the flaps in the book.

Just for fun


- <u>Mine!</u> by Jeff Mack With just one word, this author tells the tale of one rock and two mice. Also check out Look!
- <u>Still stuck</u> by Shinsuke Yoshitake A little boy gets stuck in his shirt while getting undressed and imagines what his life would be like if he never got out.
- Windows by Julia Denos As a young boy walks his dog one evening, the windows
 he passes provide glimpses into the diverse lives of the people who live behind them.

- Who Am I? An animal guessing game by Steve Jenkins Use the clues to guess which animal will appear on the next page.
