Summer Reading Ideas for Students Entering Kindergarten

Animal Stories

- Big chickens by Leslie Helakoski - Four chickens are rather easily frightened; will they conquer their fears? Big chickens fly the coop and Big chickens go to town are also by Leslie Helakoski.
- Horrible Bear by Ame Dyckman - When a little girl's kite breaks, she blames the "horrible bear," who doesn't think he's horrible. But since she called him "horrible", he prepares to live up to his name.
- Alfie: The turtle that disappeared by Thyra Heder - Alfie has never done much, until one day when he disappears on a quest to find his owner the perfect birthday gift.

Dinosaurs

- Chalk by Bill Thomson - Amazing pictures will captivate you in this wordless book.
- How do dinosaurs say goodnight? (and others) by Jane Yolen - Incredibly versatile author writes for kids of all ages.

Folk Tales, Fairy Tales, and Updated Classic Tales

- Interrupting chicken by David Ezra Stein – Hilarious story about a chicken and her bedtime stories!
- Princess and the pony by Kate Beaton – Pinecone is sick of getting cozy sweaters for her birthday. So she asks for a horse, but gets a chubby pony who farts.
- The three bears ABC by Grace MacCarone – An alphabetical retelling of Goldilocks and the three bears.

Just for Fun

- How to find an elephant by Kate Banks – Grab some binoculars, a blanket, a flute, some imagination, and a whole lot of curiosity. Ready? Come join the elephant hunt.
- Not a box by Antoinette Portis – The best toy in the world finally gets its due!
- Not quite narwhal by Jessica Sima – Kelp can't decide if he is a sea unicorn or a land narwhal? A touching story about being different.

Pet Stories

- Move over, Rover by Karen Beaumont – A steady stream of animals tries to take shelter in the doghouse!
- When Tiny was tiny by Cari Meister– Great series about a large dog named Tiny.
- Who wants broccoli? by Val Jones – Broccoli is a large dog who loves attention. Will he ever find a family and a new home away from the animal shelter?

Super Science Books

- Animals upside down: A pull, pop, lift, and learn book by Steven Jenkins – A unique pop-up book all about the how and why of upside down animal behavior.
- Coyote Moon by Maria Gianferrari – Stunning pictures and almost poetic text tell the story of a coyote mother on the hunt to find food for her hungry pups.
- What if you had animal teeth? by Sandra Markle – If you could have any animal's front teeth which would you choose? Also look for What if you had animal hair?

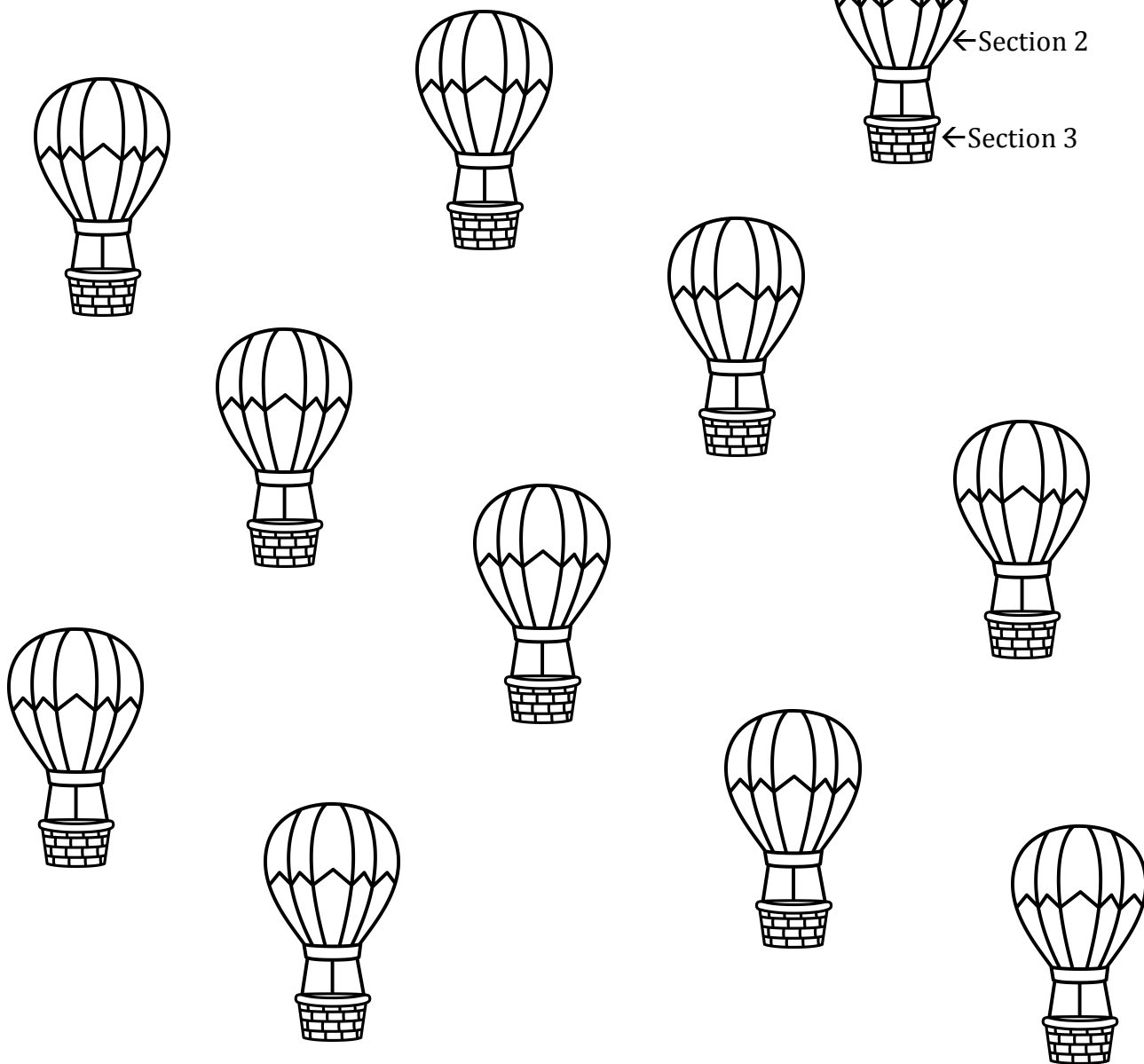
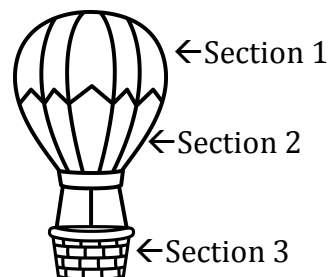
Read Aloud Chapter Books
