- 5 hours in support of CA programs or at CA

Before a student begins her/his off-campus service work, s/he must have approval from the Service Board, a student organization that manages and oversees Upper School service work. In order to receive approval, a student should submit a proposal form to the Service Board. Proposal forms and completion forms, along with FAQs about Service Board's evaluation procedure, appear on the Service Board website: sites.google.com/columbusacademy.org/ serviceboard.

- Go to the tab titled RESOURCES 2.
- Scroll down to the SERVICE BOARD icon and click on 'Service 3. Board'
- Once you are on the Service Board's website, look at the top of the page for tabs titled FAQs, Forms, Site profiles, etc. Click the tab titled FORMS to find the electronic proposal form.

*Students need to use their CA account to LOGIN.

During the school year at the US Activities Period, the Service Board meets weekly to evaluate proposals and share service opportunities. During the summer months and over extended breaks, proposals are evaluated by the SHAPERS, the Service Board's student steering committee. Students, their parents and advisor are notified via email regarding the acceptance or denial of all proposals. During the school year meeting minutes, including decisions regarding proposals, are sent out each week to all US students via email.

Students can submit proposals in TWO ways:

- 1. Via the Service Board website (See above four steps to access forms on Service Board Website.)
- 2. Via hard copy to Mrs. Bening (Service Dept. Chair). Hard copies may be left in the brown wooden box on the shelf outside her office. Her office is located on the first floor of the US, next door to the US Dean's office.

Fully completed service activity completion forms should be submitted to the wooden box outside the Service Office. Hard copies of proposal forms and completion forms can be found on the Lifesaver Board. All completed



service work is verified and recorded on the website by Mrs. Frickel.

In order to achieve this goal, the school has established a service graduation requirement to expose students to need-based service opportunities. This exposure serves as a path to extended community service and as a means to introduce students to the needs of others locally and globally.

Based on the school's mission, standards and community service statement, students are expected to complete 50 hours of service (45 hours off-campus and 5 hours supporting CA programs) in order to receive an Columbus Academy diploma. Beginning after the completion of their eighth grade year, students have about four years to complete this requirement.
