### **UPPER SCHOOL GENERAL INFORMATION**

#### Faculty, Staff and Sr. Counselors

CA Summer Experience employs current CA Faculty and Staff members as well as highly qualified outside sources as teachers of the Summer Experience programs. Sr. Counselors are typically local college students who have been hired after an extensive interview and training process. Sr. Counselors are assigned to camps each week and will accompany your child all day during their respective camp. CA Summer Experience also employs ample administrative staff to support daily programming.

#### Communication

Upon registration with full payment, you should receive a confirmation email from Summer\_Experience@columbusacademy.org with your child's class schedule and additional information. You can expect communication via email from your child's teacher the Friday prior to camp starting and the Wednesday during the respective camp week. If registration is received late, there may be a delay in this communication.

### **Facilities**

A majority of programs are held on CA's beautiful 231-acre campus that consists of a six-lane indoor pool, computer labs with iMac computers, nature trails, outdoor classroom space, low ropes elements, eight tennis courts, Schoedinger Theatre seating 430, two full-length gymnasiums, a weight room, a ceramics studio, five art studios, three libraries, five playgrounds, eight science labs, four soccer fields, two turf fields, an all-weather track, a full service dining hall, three music rooms, and two baseball fields. The campus may be accessed from the West on Cherry Bottom Road or from the East via Beecher Road off of Hamilton Road. (Please refer to the campus map on the inside of the back cover.)

### Field Trip and Off-Site Transportation

Columbus Academy utilizes school bus rental as a means of transportation for field trips and off-site programs. All drivers have proof of credentials and background checks. CA also has a fleet of 7 passenger vans that will be used for smaller traveling groups. All drivers are employees of Columbus Academy and are van-certified.

### Lunch

Lunch is provided by Columbus Academy's Dining Service for **most** of the programs and is built into the price of the camp for Sessions 1-9. Session 10 camps will <u>all</u> be required to pack a lunch as the Dining Hall will remain closed August 6-10. Most off-site camps require students to bring a lunch; please check individual course descriptions for lunch specifications. During

Sessions 1-9, CA offers a hot main dish including vegetarian options, as well as a salad bar, pasta bar, and deli bar. We also do our best to accommodate all dietary requests / restrictions. Please contact our office if you have additional questions related to dietary concerns. Children are welcome to pack a lunch if they wish, but the lunch must be peanut and tree nut free.

#### Daily Drop-off/Pick-up

There will be signage all around campus to help direct parking, as well as a color coded system to follow from the parking areas to help guide you to the correct entrance. Please see the CA campus map on the inside of the back cover for general parking information. Upper School will follow the BLUE signage.

Check-in for Upper School (rising 9th through 12th grade) programs is in the Barton Room Lobby unless otherwise specified. Staff will meet with their class and continue on to their assigned classroom. After the first day of class, students may go directly to the appropriate classroom. Upper School parents or students should follow campus signage to the Upper School parking area (Parent Hall Parking Lot). There will be CA Staff available to help students get to their check-in areas.

## Late Drop-off/Early Pick-up

If it is necessary to drop off or pick up your child at any time other than the designated camp times, the Floating Counselor is available to help with these transitions. If you know this information ahead of time, you may write it on the sheet provided at the Help Desk outside the gyms. You may also contact the Floating Counselor any time during camp hours at 614-653-3117 to arrange a pick-up or drop-off. *Note: Early pick ups are not available after 3:30pm.* 

### **Electronics Policy**

With the increase in the technology around us, electronics are no longer prohibited at camp; however, we expect that these devices be put away unless specifically required for a camp or in the case of an emergency. We have designated screen time during Before and After Care for those who wish to participate. Check-in/out in the gyms and/or Barton Room will be strictly enforced as "no device zones".

### **Discipline Action Plan and Termination**

Attendees who are found to bully or harass others will generally be subject to serious disciplinary action, including prohibition from further attendance. Children will receive one warning and CA Summer Experience reserves the right to remove any camper from our program for disciplinary reasons. If a child is removed for disciplinary reasons, there will be no refund.

## FEES, CANCELATIONS AND DEADLINES

Course fees are located in the course descriptions and registration pages. Whether submitting a paper form or registering online, **registration is not complete until payment is received.** Cancelations or changes made prior to the appropriate deadline will incur no penalty and will be refunded in full. Cancelations made after the deadlines will be refunded at 25% of the program fee. Please understand that after these deadlines, we have made firm financial commitments to our faculty and staff, in addition to purchasing materials for the class. If a cancelation is made after the camp's start date, there will be no refund issued. Changes made to schedules after the deadlines will be charged a non-refundable fee of \$25 per child plus any difference in camp fees. If late registrations are received after the deadlines, camp fees increase by 10%.

# **UPPER SCHOOL SUMMER EXPERIENCE**

Programs are in alphabetical order and categorized by Curriculum-Based Offerings, Academics and Arts & Sciences programming. The Upper School Registration Form is on page 59. Please note: "rising" indicates the grade your child will be entering in the 2018-2019 school year.

# **Curriculum-Based Offerings**

Credit courses can be taken for preview, review, or credit. Only students who successfully complete credit courses will receive the number of credits indicated in the course descriptions. Please check with your child's school prior to registering for these courses, as we do not guarantee that earned credits will transfer to all schools. Columbus Academy will mail a letter for proof of course completion and notification of final grade (if applicable) to your home address by the conclusion of the Summer Experience program in August. A copy of this letter will also be sent to the records department of your child's school.

### **Feed the Hungry**

Rising 9-12 | Session 5-6 | Instructor: Jessica Espasandin 8:30a-3:30p | \$300 for the two-week program

This community service camp visits a variety of sites that provide support to the hungry in the Columbus community including the Mid-Ohio Food Bank, Meals-On-Wheels/LifeCare Alliance, Westerville Area Resource Ministry, Worthington Food Pantry, YWCA Family Center and local community gardens. At each site, we will learn about the problem of hunger in our community and participate in a variety of tasks to help alleviate this growing social justice problem. Projects will include the planting and harvesting of fresh produce, food sorting and distribution, grocery shopping, and the preparation, delivery, and serving of hot meals to adults and children in a variety of settings. Successful completion of this camp satisfies the Columbus Academy Upper School graduation requirement of 45 hours of off-campus community service hours. Daily attendance during both weeks of camp is mandatory to receive credit - no exceptions. Students are required to pack a peanut and tree nut free lunch and water bottle each day. There is a maximum of 14 students for this program and spaces fill quickly. **■** This is a traveling/off-site program.

### **Geometry Credit**

Rising 10-12 | Session 2-8 | Instructor: John Street 8:30a-12p | \$825 for the seven-week program Prerequisite: Algebra 1 taken in 9th grade or above.

This course is for high school students who have previously taken Algebra 1 in 9th grade (or later) to gain the skills in geometry and get back on grade level. This course is not an acceleration option for middle school students. In standard-level geometry, students will learn the concepts of Euclidean geometry. Congruency and similarity will be studied within the context of triangles, quadrilaterals, and other polygons. New problem-solving skills are developed in solid geometry, right triangle trigonometry, and analytic and coordinate geometry. The curriculum is designed to incorporate deductive reasoning, algebraic manipulation, and technology as students develop a greater understanding of proofs, logic, observation, measurement and description. Geometry provides the foundational concepts and thought processes required for pre-calculus, calculus and standardized tests. By taking this course, you can earn one credit for high school geometry. Daily attendance is required for credit.

### **Physical Education Credit**

2-week program | Two weeks for three hours per day Rising 9-12 | Session 2-3 | Instructor: Ron Leach 9a-12p | \$270 for the two-week program Intensive program | One week for seven hours (M-R), four hours (F) Rising 9-12 | Session 4, 6, 7 | Instructors: Ali Hildahl & Mark Slater 8a-3p (M-R) and 8a-12p (F) | \$295 for each one-week program In this class, we will be engaged in sport activity, as well as basic fitness. Tennis, golf, bowling, ultimate frisbee, soccer, softball, basketball, football, and track and field will be some of the sports activities. A half hour lunch is provided for the intensive PE program unless otherwise notified. By taking this class, you can earn one quarter credit for high school Physical Education. Columbus Academy students will earn one unit toward the six-unit graduation requirement. Daily attendance is mandatory to receive credit – no exceptions.

## Aim High College Prep Series: ACT

Rising 9-12 | Session 1 (M-W, F), 6 | Instructor: Ihab Ismail 1: 9a-2:30p | \$320 6: 9a-2:30p | \$395

This comprehensive, personalized ACT course aims to help each student identify areas of strength and challenge, apply a plan to solidify performance, and measure the progress made in all sections of the ACT. The instructor will connect with each family to gain insight into the student's academic background and learning style and offer recommendations. The objective test date for this training is June 9th, 2018 for Session 1 and July 14th, 2018 for Session 6. *Please note this course is not offered as a continuation or in conjunction with existing CA sponsored test prep programs.*

### Be a Junior Counselor at CA

Rising 8-11 | Session 1-10 | Instructor: Jr. Counselor Ambassador Full (9a-4p) \$80/week (Sessions 1 and 5: \$65/week)

Join our dynamic team this summer and put experience on your resume. This opportunity is a hands-on volunteer leadership experience for any student going into eighth through eleventh grade. Duties of a junior counselor include helping with camp activities, supporting a senior counselor, escorting campers, helping with check-in and snack time, and having fun in the sun at Columbus Academy. If you have not had a job before, this program will give you the experience you will need to succeed in your next opportunity and will give you leadership skills that will follow you the rest of your life. By becoming a part of our team, you will have fun, make friends, and learn valuable skills. Each participant will receive a certificate of completion and a review to put in his or her job portfolio. Students and a parent/guardian are required to attend a mandatory orientation on Saturday, June 2, from 12 to 2 pm. This program is limited to ten participants per week, and spaces fill quickly.
